The UN has declared the following statement:

"All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights. Everyone has the right to recognition everywhere as a person before the law. We recall that our obligations under international law prohibit discrimination of any kind on the basis of race, colour, sex, language, religion, political or other opinion, national or social origin, property, birth or other status." - UN General Assembly October 2016

Sounds like it is all encompassing but is clearly selective when it comes to particular rights of whole segments of society. One such segment that is misrepresented in Canada is the preborn child.

Virtually no protection at any stage of pregnancy allows a preborn baby to be aborted up until the time of birth. Violent attacks against pregnant women that result in the death of their preborn baby are not prosecuted as a crime against the preborn since the baby does not enjoy personhood or even human status.

To add insult to injury, recorded statistics are woefully misrepresented, under reported and inaccurate, even repressed by agencies that block access of freedom of information. One may surmise that obscured information delegitimizes the negative social repercussions from the widespread destruction of human life not only to the unborn but also the impediment of the social well being of parents and families.

The simplistic slogan of "My body, my choice" is never that easy unless the motivation behind the false premise is based on deception, racism and eugenics exploited by the founders of abortion on demand.

Canada plans to give away large sums of money to international organizations to provide abortion services. Will it be alongside the maternal, newborn and child health Muskoka Initiative passed by the last administration or will it bypass it in favour of population control initiatives? New targets will be set by the current administration.

Other freedoms of expression are being maligned in Canada with the euthanasia law and the loss of conscience rights of those who oppose direct or indirect application in the medical establishment.

The UN statement holds true for a select some, however falls short of supporting the Canadian Charter of Rights and freedoms of others and instead of fostering "mutual respect" it fosters discrimination through abortion by sex-selection, level of physical and mental capacity or social status.

The order of the March 21st UN Declaration for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination seems to show bias by supporting or targeting some races and religions over others that is in direct violation of its own mandate. *
