How the Abolitionists Won

Serving the Community for over 40 years

It was 175 years ago today that Britain became the world's first major power to aboush slavery. On Aug. 1, 1838, the Empire officially freed its 800,000 African slaves, who had been re-designated as "apprentices" four years earlier by the Slavery Abolition Act. Abolitionists had fought for more than 50 years to reach this goal, facing odds which, in the 1780s, looked insurmountable.

When the Society for Effecting the Abolition of the Slave Trade was formed in 1787, public opinion overwhelmingly accepted slavery as normal, natural, and legitimate. Slavery of various kinds had been the norm throughout human history, from the Roman Empire to the Aztecs and Incas; from prisoners taken in African and North American tribal wars to serfdom in Russia.

Slavery in the West Indies provided Europeans with affordable sugar, coffee, tobacco, rice and rum. The slave trade and its secondary industries (shipbuilding, for instance) employed thousands, and generated millions in tax revenues for grateful governments. Europeans enjoyed these products without thinking too much about their cruel and bloody origins.

In addition to the hurdles of public opinion and of fighting a profitable industry, another obstacle facing British abolitionists was the predominance in their ranks of an unpopular religious minority. Quakers were pacifist egalitarian democrats who refused military service, and refused to pay taxes or tithes to the Church of England. They wore plain clothes made of un-dyed wool. They rejected music, novels and the use of tombstones. Unless praying or preaching, Quakers refused to remove their peculiar broad-brimmed high-crowned hats, even in the presence of royalty. They would not address anyone as "my Lord" (God alone being Lord). Although Quakers were no longer being actively persecuted or killed in the 1780s, they were still excluded from power, (only Church of England adherents could be Members of Parliament), influence, and respectability. Few cared about what they had to say.

How did a movement dominated by unpopular religious minorities (Quakers were later joined by evangelical Anglicans like William Wilberforce) succeed in persuading Parliament to end a popular industry that brought so much pleasure and prosperity to so many people? By exposing the horrors of the slave trade, and this by using visual images in addition to the printed word. A diagram of the slave ship Brookes showed MPs, and the general public, how hundreds of Africans were chained side-by-side at the bottom of the ship, in a space only two feet and eight inches high. Africans sold to the British by other Africans were forced to lie in their own urine, feces and vomit for many weeks before reaching the West Indies. Sick slaves were thrown overboard. In 1782, the slave ship Zong threw 130 slaves overboard, and ensuing litigation was concerned uniquely with the legal question as to whether the insurance company was required to cover this loss of "property." Those who survived the journey across the Atlantic were branded with a hot iron, sold and then compelled to spend the rest of their lives growing and harvesting sugar cane and other crops. Labour was compelled by whips, and disobedience punished by various methods of torture. Slaves who dared to revolt were burned alive.


In addition to using visual images that were simply unanswerable, the abolitionists succeeded because they were incrementalists. While wanting to abolish slavery itself, their initial efforts were centered exclusively on abolishing the slave trade. They picked a winnable issue, and rejected the absolutist argument that abolishing the slave trade would constitute an unholy "compromise". Two decades of political activism, lobbying and public education paid off when Parliament abolished the slave trade in 1807. Only then did the abolitionists commence the next phase of their difficult struggle to abolish slavery itself.

Starting with a small group of determined men who met at a print shop in London on May 22, 1787, to begin the campaign against the slave trade, the abolitionist movement is an example of how evil can only be overcome by determination, perseverance, hard work and sacrifice. This movement also demonstrates the truth of a popular saying: "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed citizens can change the world. Indeed, it is the only thing that ever has."

"Ventilation and respiration are required for life on earth. Ventilation is movement of air; respiration is exchange of oxygen and carbon dioxide occurring in the lungs and via circulation in all tissues of the

living person. Muscles of the chest and diaphragm contract for inhalation. Elastic recoil of lungs and chest wall causes exhalation. If breathing stops, for life to continue, ventilation must be initiated quickly.

After true death chest compressions or a ventilator can only move air; there cannot be respiration. Contrariwise, if such efforts at ventilation and respiration are successful, that can be only because soul and body unity is still present. Respiration, circulation and heart beat can be present only in a living person, not a cadaver. If "probably dead" or "apparently dead" (mors apparens) is applied to a person who is not truly dead, he will certainly be truly dead when his beating heart is cut out in other words, killing the person. Is Planned Parenthood still Relevant after 40 years?

(Below are some notes from my TV interview on Talk Local this past June 18th, 2013.)

Just as we honoured 40 years of service in the community last year so Planned Parenthood celebrated 40 years of service this year. Public Health pays for PP services through the municipality while prolife groups are not supported or paid by the municipality. Public Health provides a wide range of reproductive health services and should distance themselves from Planned Parenthood as their partner in reproductive health.

After 40 years PP still has the same aim as their foundress Margaret Sanger who said in 1915, "The Most merciful thing That The Large Family does To One of its Infant Members is to Kill it." She was a racist and a believer in eugenics. (Birth Control League of America)

Planned Parenthood America still has the following aims and objectives:

Unrestricted sexual freedom—Exhaustive sex-education programs that break down conventional moral values—Free access to contraception and abortion—Diminishing parental rights (Young clients don't have to tell their parents) All backed up by abortion—Population control in particular for the poor, mentally and physically disadvantaged along with minorities i.e. African Americans, Hispanics

Has PP been part of today's breakdown of moral values? Yes. PP offered a package solution to the public to overcome Judeo-Christian values that still exists: The motto: "If it feels good, do it. " Abortion: "It's just a blob of tissue. " My body. My choice."

In North America reproductive freedom made contraception, abortion and sterilization fully accessible in the early 1970's. A booklet was sent across the USA in 1976 to thousands of health agencies that stated: **11 million teenagers**: What can be done about the epidemic of adolescent pregnancies in the US? the growing problem of teen pregnancy and how it causes death, defect and illness. (The actual number was 1 million per year, the majority being 18 and 19 years old),

The word "epidemic" caught on as the 'disease of pregnancy.' The misinformation was sent to all the US state health departments in order to sell the lie. Public Health bought it. *John Hopkins did a study from 1971- 76 that unintended pregnancy was actually higher among contraceptive users than among non-users by 45% and abortion was up 100%.

Molecular Epidemiology Life Sciences Accountability MELISA met in New York of late to discuss **scientific evidence regarding abortion as a form of growing violence against women and girls.** Their press release states: "The indiscriminate practice of abortion is significantly correlated with coercion, a history of sexual abuse, violence during pregnancy, intimate partner violence, and psychological consequences that may lead to suicide." And now human sex trade trafficking.

SOLUTION: Public Health and Educators need to reinforce the value of human life born and unborn – respect and dignity of every human being and stop pandering to special interest groups like Planned Parenthood who believes in subjective morality that is wrong on every level and increases the problems around sexual health and the destructive subculture it has created.
